



#Digilnventors Challenge 2024 - Privacy Notice for: Scottish applicants

The #Digilnventors Challenge 2024 is a Scottish-based competition that challenges young people to identify and research health and care challenges and develop ideas that could be transformed into a potential digital solution.

The Challenge is delivered in Scotland by the Digital Health & Care Innovation Centre ("DHI"), which is hosted by the University of Strathclyde, with support from our partners dressCode, City of Glasgow College, The Scottish Tech Army and Scottish Hockey.

The Challenge has now gone global as DHI now runs a parallel competition aimed at secondary school pupils in the United Arab Emirates (UAE). The UAE competition will be delivered by the DHI's academic partner, the Heriot Watt University Dubai.

Four finalist Scottish teams will be invited to meet with the DHI at their offices in Glasgow. At the same time, four finalist UAE teams will be invited to meet representatives of the Heriot Watt University Dubai in the UAE. The eight teams will participate in a virtual "hybrid" bootcamp on 18 & 19 November 2024 (using Microsoft Teams).

The four finalist Scottish teams will then be invited to meet with the DHI at their office in Glasgow. At the same time, four finalist UAE teams will be invited to meet with representatives of the Heriot Watt University Dubai in the UAE. The eight teams will then participate in a virtual "hybrid" final on 5 December 2024 (using Microsoft Teams). A Scottish winner and a UAE winner will then be selected and announced on 9 December 2024. An award ceremony will then take place in each respective country in February 2025.

As part of the above award ceremonies each of the respective winning teams may be required to present in-person in Scotland or the UAE.

If you are a participant from Scotland, The University of Strathclyde will be responsible for processing your personal data and will provide you with relevant information about how your personal data will be used (see details below).

Privacy Notice

The University of Strathclyde is a data controller under data protection legislation. This privacy notice sets out important information regarding how we will use your information and your rights under the legislation. It is important that you read this notice prior to providing your information.

The DHI is running the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024 competition in which teams of up to four (4) young people (attending secondary school as of 1 January 2024) propose how digital technology and/or e-gaming could be used to re-invent the game of field hockey to inspire increased physical

activity, participation, and well-being of our young people? Teams can earn extra points if their idea has a positive impact on our environment and supports efforts to reach net carbon zero.

Each team must nominate a school or youth organisation that they represent and a responsible adult (over the age of 21) who will act as the team's mentor during the competition.

As part of the online application process certain personal data belonging to the mentor and team members will be collected by the DHI.

The data that will be collected is:

- School/ group name and registered address
- Council area
- Team name
- Mentor's name
- Mentor's contact information (email address and contact telephone number)
- Each team member's name, age and sex

If a team is shortlisted as a finalist during the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024 and attends the hybrid bootcamp, the hybrid final and is showcased in the award ceremony then the DHI may use the information above and/ or capture photographs, video or audio of the mentors and team members as outlined below. This information may also be shared in official press releases distributed by the DHI via our PR agency, Story Shop, to a variety of media outlets for publicity purposes.

How we use your personal data and who we may share it with

We will use the personal data you supply in the online application process to:

- ensure that you meet the criteria for applying to the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024;
- assess your application to the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024; and
- judge your application which will be done by employees of the DHI and other #Digilnventors Challenge partners.

If you are a member of a team which is shortlisted during the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024, a mentor, sponsor, partner, masterclass presenter, expert or judge, the DHI's internal marketing team, may capture photographs, video or audio footage of you for the following purposes:

- to promote the #DigiInventors Challenge by the DHI for the current and future challenges. Such promotion may include use in the DHI's advertising and resources in relation to the #DigiInventors Challenge including but not limited to the #DigiInventors Challenge website(www.digiinventors.com/), social media, advertising, press, film and video, radio and publications;
- 2. to allow Challenge partners to judge the competition entries presented by participants at the #DigiInventors Challenge bootcamp;
- 3. to create videos for the winners' presentation at a pre-determined formal award ceremony (yet to be confirmed) and to be made available via the DHI website; and
- 4. for use on #DigiInventors Challenge partner and sponsor organisation websites and resources for the purposes of promoting and advertising the #DigiInventors Challenge and the support provided by these partner organisations. Such partners may include but are not limited to dressCode, Heriot Watt University Dubai, City of Glasgow College, the Scottish Tech Army Limited and Scottish Hockey

Legal basis for processing

Under data protection legislation we are required to identify our legal basis for processing. For the online application process the legal basis for processing is the legitimate interests of The University of Strathclyde as data controller to enable the DHI to receive, assess and judge applications to the #DigiInventors Challenge 2024.

For the use of photographs, video or audio footage of you, that may be captured during your participation in the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024, we will seek consent directly from you (if over 16) or a parent/guardian (if under 16).

Retention Period

We will retain your details relating to:

- 1. the application process for a period of five years following the end of the application process at which point they will be deleted from the University's files; and
- 2. any photographs, video or audio footage of you which is captured or held by the University of Strathclyde will generally be held for a period of five years from the #Digilnventors Challenge boot camp. There may be exceptions where some of them are retained and used for a longer period of time

Your Rights*

You have the right to:

- find out what personal data we process about you and obtain a copy of the data, free of charge;
- ask us to correct inaccurate or incomplete data;
- withdraw consent to process your personal data at any time, if you were asked for and provided consent (and where no other lawful basis for processing applies); and
- restrict the processing of your personal data in certain ways;
- object to the way we are using your data;
- request that we erase your information;
- obtain a portable copy of personal data you have given to us in a commonly used electronic format.
