



Photography, Audio and Filming Permission Slip #DigiInventors Challenge hybrid bootcamp and final 2024

Background

The #DigiInventors Challenge 2024 is a Scottish-based competition which challenges young people to identify and research health and care challenges and come up with ideas that could be transformed into a potential digital solution.

The Challenge is delivered in Scotland by the Digital Health & Care Innovation Centre ("DHI"), which is hosted by the University of Strathclyde, with support from our partners dressCode, City of Glasgow College, The Scottish Tech Army and Scottish Hockey.

The Challenge has now gone global as DHI now runs a parallel competition aimed at secondary school pupils in the United Arab Emirates (UAE). The UAE competition will be delivered by the DHI's academic partner, the Heriot Watt University Dubai.

Four finalist Scottish teams will be invited to meet with the DHI at the City of Glasgow College. At the same time, four finalist UAE teams will be invited to meet representatives of the Heriot Watt University Dubai in the UAE. The eight teams will participate in a virtual "hybrid" bootcamp on 18 & 19 November 2024 (using Microsoft Teams).

The four finalist Scottish teams will then be invited to meet with the DHI at their office in Glasgow. At the same time, four finalist UAE teams will be invited to meet with representatives of the Heriot Watt University Dubai in the UAE. The eight teams will then participate in a virtual "hybrid" final on 5 December 2024 (using Microsoft Teams). A Scottish winner and a UAE winner will then be selected and announced on 9 December 2024. An award ceremony will then take place in each respective country in February 2025.

As part of the above award ceremonies each of the respective winning teams may be required to present in-person in Scotland or the UAE.

As a participant, mentor, partner, masterclass presenter, expert or judge in the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024, you have been invited to participate in:

- the #DigiInventors Challenge hybrid bootcamp which will take place in person and online using Microsoft Teams on 18 and 19 November 2024; and
- 2. the #Digilnventors Challenge virtual final which will take place in person and online using Microsoft Teams on 5 December 2024.

The University of Strathclyde, acting through the DHI, would like to record (film and audio) and photograph you participating in the #Digilnventors Challenge bootcamp and final, for the purposes described below, and requests your permission to do so.

What is personal data?

Personal data is <u>any</u> information whatsoever which can be used to identify an individual. Photographs, film and audio recordings of an individual are classed as personal data and consent is needed from that individual to allow others to record, use and share such information.

Why is the DHI collecting your personal data?

The DHI has requested each finalist team which is to attend the #Digilnventors Challenge bootcamp to submit their own high-resolution team photograph (to include all team members and their mentor) to be used alongside any press and promotional work to promote the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024.

The DHI's internal marketing team also intend to capture photographs, film and audio record the participants in the #Digilnventors Challenge bootcamp and final, and from whom the DHI has obtained the necessary permission, to promote the #Digilnventors Challenge 2024. The University of Strathclyde will ensure that they own all copyright in the photographs, audio recordings and films (including those captured by any third-party supplier) produced as part of this exercise.

How will the DHI use your personal data and who will they share it with?

If you are willing to provide consent the DHI would like to use your <u>photo</u>, <u>name</u>, <u>image</u>, <u>voice</u> or <u>likeness</u> for the following purposes:

- 1) Promotion of the #Digilnventors Challenge by the DHI for the current and future challenges. Such promotion may include use in the DHI's advertising and resources in relation to the #Digilnventors Challenge including but not limited to the #Digilnventors Challenge website (www.digiinventors.com), social media, advertising, press, film and video, radio and publications.
- 2) Video images of the participants presenting the subject matter of their competition entries at the #Digilnventors Challenge bootcamp may be shared with judges for judging purposes.
- 3) To create videos for the winners' presentation at a pre-determined formal prize-giving event (yet to be confirmed) and to be shown online on the DHI website.
- 4) Use on #Digilnventors Challenge partner and sponsor organisation websites and resources for the purposes of promoting and advertising the #Digilnventors Challenge. Such partners include but may not be limited to dressCode, Heriot Watt University Dubai, City of Glasgow College, the Scottish Tech Army Limited and Scottish Hockey.

Consent

I consent to the University of Strathclyde (DHI) using photographs and/or video recordings including images of me as described above.
